We are very grateful to the General Superior who has guided us from afar with words of encouragement and support and for sending Fr. Angelo, the General Secretary to be our resource person to guide and to animate the Chapter. We are indeed grateful to the General Secretary for his presence and for his valuable inputs. During the Chapter, we could really experience the spirit of synodality, fraternity and Dehonianity.

During the month of July, we had the canonical visit at CDN Scholasticate Community which gave the members of the community to freely share about themselves to the Superior. And on 26 July, 5 brothers renewed their vows; 3 brothers received the minor orders as Lectors, while 8 brothers received the minor orders as Acolytes. There was also the gathering of the Regents at the CDN Scholasticate community which enabled them to review, revive and renew their formative journey as Dehonian regents. As part of the ongoing developmental projects of the District, we are gradually investing for the construction of the Dehon Ashram at Arthunkal, SCJ Retreat Centre at Nambur and Dehon Book Centre at Gorantla. SCJ Renewal Centre in Kumbalanghi has inaugurated a special spiritual formative program for the Aspirants and the postulants of CRI Cochin area. We have also laid the foundation stone for the construction of the Church at Dasarigudem, the substation of Sacred Heart Mission Parish at Vempadu, with the hope and trust in the Lord as well as the generous donors, All these progressive activities reveal that the members of the District are actively and effectively engaged in various growth oriented Dehonian Mission as the Disciples of Dehon for the glory of the Divine Heart of Jesus.

Let us continue to strive to walk in the footsteps of our Founding Father Leo John Dehon whose 100th death anniversary we are preparing to celebrate soon. May his spirit be the guiding force for all of us as Dehonians with Passion for the World and the Passion for the World.
















Joyful Beginnings at the Allapally-Gundala Mission

As we began the mission in Gundala, Allapalli Parish in Khammam Diocese, we are very happy to serve and to be available to the needs of God's people. The month of July has been good and filled with joyful memories.

Beginning of this month, Fr. Jesu SCJ and Dn. Arun SCJ visited the families in our parish along with catechists. All the faithful were very happy to welcome us to their homes. We spoke with them and spent ample time with the families. We made a small statistic of all our Catholic families. They also expressed their problems and shared their joys with us. Altogether in the parish and substations, there are some 50 families in our parish. They are very poor, uneducated, and many are dropouts from studies due to financial problems.

There is an urgency for the spiritual needs of the community, and it's also important to understand the dynamics of this area, where many Hindus, Muslims, and Pentecostal churches are located.

We make an effort to assist the people in their spiritual needs and growth of faith among them. We lead the people to God by offering daily Eucharist, teaching catechism to the children, and visiting families in the parish and the outstations. There are regular youth animation programs and care and concern for the sick. It was a great and blessed moment because we celebrated the Priestly Ordination Anniversary of our Fr. Jesu Prasad SCJ, and we are so thankful to God for His gift of priesthood. On that anniversary day, we administered 5 baptisms from Gundala-Muthapuram village mission place.

We also had Grandparents' Day celebration in our parish. We honoured them for their faith and values in their journey of life as Christians. There was a food distribution for all the people who came from the parish and substations.

Background of the Place

Srisaila Mary Matha Parish is located deep within the Nallamala Forest, in a village called Sundipenta (also known as Sunnipenta). Situated among the mountains, the village is approximately 50 km above sea level. It was formed in the 1960s when people from various parts of India came to construct the Srisailam Dam. The power project began in 1960, and the main dam was completed in 1981.

People's Background

As construction extended over 21 years, many workers settled permanently, forming a culturally diverse and close-knit community.

Catholic Population

Officially, there are 80 registered Catholic families, though in reality, around 50 families remain. On Sundays, approximately 80–100 faithful attend Holy Mass. There is great potential to grow this number.

Distance from the City

The nearest town, Dornala, lies 60 km away. The journey to Sundipenta involves traveling 50 km through dense forest terrain, which is unsafe due to wild animal encounters. For safety, four-wheeled vehicles or government buses are recommended. Financial Situation of the Mission Parish

With the dam's completion, job opportunities dwindled. Most residents now commute daily to the Srisailam Hindu Temple to work in satrams (lodging for devotees), perform cleaning tasks, or engage in small businesses. Farming is not viable due to lack of arable land.

Pastoral and Spiritual Activities

- Daily Holy Mass is offered.
- On First Fridays, Sacred Heart devotion is introduced with Holy Eucharistic Adoration, gradually introducing Dehonian Spirituality.
- Given the parish's dedication to Mother Mary, a special devotion is conducted every second Saturday, including a Marian Mass, procession, and Adoration.
- I offer Communion to the sick and conduct house visits for fraternal dialogue.
- The Legion of Mary is active, hosting prayers at church and in parishioners' homes.
- The Vincent de Paul group, currently inactive, shows promise for revival.

I am steadily getting to know the people and adjusting to the place. One of the most urgent challenges is water scarcity, as villagers receive water only once a week. This year marks the Silver Jubilee of our parish church, which was inaugurated 25 years ago. With no substations in our parish territory, this milestone celebration on December 8th is especially meaningful.

My One-Month Experience in Italy – A Journey of Learning and Grace

It has been a month since I arrived in Italy to pursue my Licentiate in Dogmatic Theology. This journey marks a significant chapter in my life, both spiritually and academically. Walking through the streets of Rome, visiting the Vatican, and praying at the tombs of the saints were overwhelming experiences that deepened my sense of vocation and mission.

After my brief stay in Rome, I moved to Padova, where I am now part of our Dehonian community. Padova, with its serene atmosphere and rich academic tradition, offers a perfect environment for focused learning and spiritual reflection. People may welcome us in their own ways, which might be different from our expectations. Therefore, it is essential to be open-hearted and ready to adapt to the reality of the place we are in. With humility and respect, we learn to adjust and grow, embracing both the challenges and blessings of this journey.

This first month has been a grace-filled time of transition, adaptation, and inner growth. I am grateful for this opportunity, and I carry with me the prayerful support of my family, friends, my Congregation, and my community as I continue this journey of learning and service.
