The highlight of the month of February was the visit of Fr. Vien Nguyen SCJ, the US Provincial Superior who made 3 weeks visit to the Indian District, to know its complex realities, its rich cultural heritage and above all to know the Dehonian confreres and their mission and to preach the Annual Dehonian Retreat. We wish and pray that they may be truly be Priests according to the Heart of Christ, our Supreme High Priest. During the month of February, we also had a fruitful meeting with the bishop of Rayagada, Most. Rev. He has also given us the place to start our Minor Seminary to foster the north Indian Vocations. Dehonian Retreat for a Dynamic Dehonianity

Fr. Vien Nguyen SCJ's Dehonian Insights in India

A retreat is a break for the heart and the mind. It creates a breathing space for Meeting with God in silence, reading 'The Word' and rekindling the fire of our faith; Reflecting on the meaning of our existence, taking a step back before making important choices in our lives and ministries. The themes of our Annual Retreat commenced with the concept of individualism and culminated in the notion of Sint Unum, representing a collective journey towards this ideal. Each session focused on Dehonian themes and mottos such as Ecce Venio, Ecce Ancilla, Oblation, Reparation, and Adveniat Regnum Tum., etc.

Fr. Vien Nguyen SCJ, the US Provincial, who was our preacher, has provided us the profound insights into the life of our Founding Father, Leo John Dehon, establishing connections with both Scripture and our Constitution. The discussions were rooted in scriptural teachings and the experiences of Fr. Dehon, exploring his mission in founding the congregation and his efforts to unite the religious (members) of his era. Despite facing challenges and conflicts within the congregation, Fr. Dehon exemplified the love of Christ throughout his life.

The talks were concise yet impactful, delivering a compelling message and embodying the Dehonian spirit in our respective ministries. Each session was aimed to inspire us to embrace our charism and dedicate ourselves fully to the mission entrusted to us in India. At the conclusion of each session, a space was created by the preacher for interaction, dialogue, and reflective questions, which prompted us to consider our response to the Dehonian call. In summary, the four days of retreat provided us with four significant insights to help us live out our charism and express our Dehonianness.

- 1. Our Religious life emphasizes on interdependence rather than self-serving (selfish) motivations such as individualism, hedonism, and minimalism. These concepts foster the personal development, neglecting the growth of the community as a whole.
- 2. The reflections on Ecce venio and Ecce Ancilla encourage us to embrace various challenging missions in the spirit of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Fr. Dehon. Engaging in missionary work is undoubtedly demanding; however, during times of fear, distress, and adversity, as Fr. Vien Nguyen SCJ reminded us through Fr. Dehon's experiences, we must turn to the Sacred Heart, which serves as our source of solace and comfort.
- 3. In our efforts to establish the Kingdom of God on earth, reparatory work must be grounded in the principle of love. Fr. Vien Nguyen SCJ reminded us of the collaborative efforts that initiated the Mission in India, emphasizing the importance of many individuals working together. He urged us to utilize our unique gifts for a shared mission in India, thereby enhancing our Dehonian presence.
- 4. By adopting the principles of solidarity, we are called to accept one another and to invite all individuals to engage with the Church, allowing them to experience salvation through our Dehonian approach. Drawing inspiration from St. John's vision of Sint Unum, Fr. Vien Nguyen SCJ presented three aspects/dimensions of Sint Unum—spiritual, communal, and ministerial—to emphasize the richness of our community life and the necessity of remaining united despite our differences and the realities we face. He aptly quoted Fr. Dehon, stating that it is the Eucharist that binds/unites us together, and our hearts should serve as a ciborium, inclusive of everyone.

Fr. Vien's Approach in his Visit to India

Fr. Vien Nguyen SCJ has recently arrived in India for the first time, spending approximately three weeks in the Indian District. Since his arrival, he has been actively visiting all our communities, including both Formation and Pastoral, in Chennai, Kerala, and Andhra Pradesh, while also exploring notable locations in the vicinity. His enthusiasm for travel is evident as he continues to explore cities, shrines, and institutions where our scholastics are engaged in their studies, as well as visiting our mission stations where Dehonian confreres serve across various states. He has demonstrated a keen interest in understanding the Indian culture and has conveyed his appreciation for the warm and respectful welcome he has received as a Dehonian Confrere.

Fr. Vien Nguyen SCJ, while serving as the Provincial of the United States, exemplifies simplicity, humility, warmth, friendliness, openness, adaptability, and a grounded demeanour. His approach and willingness to engage with the Indian confreres was particularly noteworthy. As Dehonians, we are recognized globally for our hospitality, and as Indians, we aimed to extend the finest Dehonian hospitality. Despite expressing gratitude for our hospitality, he made a concerted effort to partake in the same simple meals that we enjoyed, stating that there was no need to take the trouble of preparing special dishes for him, as he preferred to eat what everyone else would eat. He truly embodied this sentiment, having no complaints regarding his stay, meals, or accommodations, and he successfully managed to enjoy the spicy food.

I was deeply moved by his demonstration of Dehonian fraternity and impressed by his ability to connect with everyone, whether they are students or priests. He exhibits remarkable patience in listening to others and offers valuable advice. He embodies the true spirit of a Dehonian and his 'Dehonianness' is evident in his manner of speaking, preaching, engaging with others, and living his life. He is a dynamic and an effective leader with a compelling vision for the future of the congregation. My understanding of his approach may not fully capture the depth of his actual experiences. Believing that he must have had a wonderful time in India with all our Indian confreres and I express my sentiments of gratitude for everything that Fr. Vien and the U.S. Province have contributed to the Indian District. Looking forward to his second coming here I, remain.

We read in Mt 28:19-20:

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

This Great Commission is a powerful reminder that the growth of the mission is not just about numbers but about transforming lives through faith in Christ. Odisha has seen mission expansion through:

Education: We are sharing our insights and our knowledge with the tribals as a Dehonian Missionaries and creating various possibilities and platforms to continue educating the youth and kids. Through this process, we get an opportunity to share Gospel to all these people.

Social Service & Healthcare: The conditions of the people keep improving as we continue to work hard and help them out to understand the meaning of life by taking them to hospitals and provide medication and save their lives. Due to no medical facilities in the vicinity, the new health care centre is under construction and still awaits for the financial support to complete. We Thank the local benefactors who continue to donate either money or time; while visiting here they become part of various construction work as per their profession. We as Dehonians keep visiting families and study the conditions of their lives and provide them the basic needs as far as possible. Moreover, enable them to be self-sufficient. We have our own confreres who are helping the families through counselling and providing them with Catholic family guidelines. We seek everyone's support and prayers to continue this mission.

Evangelization: We as Dehonians work hard with the catechist and Local believers and spread the Good News in different places.

Permission for the Dehonians to have the Canonical Presence in Odisha:

Rev.Fr. Michael Augustine SCJ (District Superior) had a fruitful meeting with the bishop of Rayagada diocese. While appreciating our Dehonian mission work the local Bishop invited us to establish our permanent presence and allowed us to have Kundra Bloc as Parish with the written agreement for 25 years.

We together with the community made a visit to the local Bishop of Rayagada, Odisha and looked for the temporary community building for starting our new minor seminary. We got the well-structured building that belongs to the diocese of Rayagada given by the Bishop with the written permission for three years.

Challenges & Perseverance

Mission work in Odisha has been a painful and tiresome work because of the prevalent conditions and situations and less resources to support us as we also live with the fear of persecution, resistance, and difficulties, yet faith has continued to grow. A verse that strengthens us in such times is Romans 8:35, 37:

Innovative Initiatives & Intuitive Insights at the Infant Jesus Church

All things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose". (Romans 8:28).

Dear brothers in Christ! It is a complete privilege for me to share with you my Pastoral ministry experience at Thallacheruvu parish in Infant Jesus Church.

Thallacheruvu is a Diocesan Parish that falls under the Guntur Diocese. It is a beautiful and big Catholic village, located among the mountains, ponds and the green fields. It is said to be the 3rd biggest catholic parish in both the Telugu states. This is an almost Complete Catholic village having about 1500 catholic families. This is one of the traditional parishes and this year we are celebrating the Diamand (75th) Jubilee of our parish.

On the feast day of St. John Maria Vianney, I started my Pastoral ministry and it was the first time for me to meet the Parish priest, Rev. Fr. Dr. Anthony Raju Putti. Gradually I understood that he is one of the nicest priests I met in my life. He has a heart for the people. The way he engages himself with the people I feel that I am working with a religious priest. He is prayerful, hardworking and enthusiastic. He gives me a lot of opportunities to administer the Sacraments and he also encourages me to start weekly masses at our substations like Cherukum Palem, Thaduvay, Kogantivari Palem and Atchampeta (recently started) other than the regular Sunday masses.

I came over here with a lot of prejudices and preoccupations because everyone was new to me but i surrendered everything in the hands of God and I believed that, this is the plan of God I began my ministry. The first day was shocking because I had to celebrate the first Sunday mass at 4 o'clock in the morning. I felt like, I was celebrating midnight mass; I was never used to it but now I got more used to it. I am the first SCJ (Dehonian) priest to work in this parish as an assistant priest.

People are very good, simple, hospitable and caring. People respect priests very much, they value priests. Punctuality is maintained for all the spiritual activities.

I am regular in celebrating the daily masses, visiting and giving communion to the Sick, and I take part in the Legion of Mary group meetings. We also have a beautiful Adoration Chapel where I can spendsome time before the Blessed Sacrament, from where I receive the strength to engage myself fully in the ministry.
