

Ongoing Formation, Batch I, with Fr. David CSsR

Fr. David, a redemptorist priest, led inspiring sessions on the essential aspects of priestly life, aiming to deepen our commitment and help us live our priesthood more fully and effectively. The key areas covered included:

1. Embracing a Spirit of Prayer

Fr. David reminded us that the spirit of prayer goes beyond just the feeling of prayer. He emphasized cultivating a steady, enduring relationship with God through a prayerful disposition, which sustains us even in times of spiritual dryness or emotional challenges. True prayer flows from this spirit, anchoring us in our daily ministry.

2. Taking Care of Ourselves and Our Brothers

He encouraged us to practice self-care and foster a culture of mutual support within our priestly community. Recognizing our own needs and looking out for our brother priests, including our families, keeps us grounded and resilient in ministry.

3. Cultivating Detachment and Letting Go

Fr. David highlighted the importance of detachment from material possessions and ego-driven desires. As priests, we are called to a life of simplicity and freedom. This "letting go" attitude helps us to focus on God's will and remain available to serve others wholeheartedly.

4. Commitment to Reconciliation

The journey of priesthood is deeply connected to the sacraments of reconciliation and absolution. Fr. David encouraged us to embrace these sacraments not only as ministers but also as individuals, recognizing their vital role in our own growth and healing, as well as in the spiritual journeys of those we serve.

5. Overcoming Ego

Humility is foundational to priestly life. Fr. David discussed the need to overcome ego and to let go of self-centered ambitions or pride that can cloud our vision. A priest is most effective when he is humble, open, and allows Christ to work through him.

6. Living the Priestly Sacrifice

As priests, we have dedicated our lives to follow Christ in a radical way, often renouncing personal comforts and attachments. Fr. David reminded us that the priest is, at his core, a man of sacrifice. This lifelong commitment began in our youth and continues to shape us, calling us to a life of offering and service to others.

7. Strengthening Our Relationship with Christ

Central to our vocation is an intimate, ever-growing relationship with Jesus Christ. Fr. David emphasized that this relationship is the heart of our priesthood, sustaining us in all we do and in all the challenges we face.

In addition to these reflections, Fr. David facilitated a group activity that allowed us to engage more deeply with these themes, encouraging practical steps for incorporating them into our daily lives.

Fr. David's sessions were not only uplifting but also provided us with clear, actionable insights to enrich our lives and ministries. It was a powerful reminder of our unique calling and the importance of living it out with renewed purpose and joy.

Ongoing Formation, Batch II with Fr. David CSsR

The ongoing formation sessions for the second batch began on 20th December. Fr. Sundar Raj, the community Superior, introduced the resource person, Fr. David from Bangalore. He belongs to the Redemptorist Congregation. He is a motivational speaker, preacher and his inputs are practical.

He started the first Session, with the introduction that, "He was not going to talk about something that we do not know". The first session was mainly focused on the life story of a doctor named, Dr. Sivakumar. His approach to the patients who came to him with hopelessness, was highlighted in his talk. Through the experience of this doctor, Fr. David told how we as priests need to update, learn, relax and learn from one another.

The second session was centred around the following questions.

What is the necessity of priests? Do we need priests today?

Father shared a few incidents in connection with these points. The session concluded by emphasising the point that, "the Lord has chosen you from the many and imperfections are part of our reality." The third session was merely a game. Through the game, a few points like hesitation, working together, Dialogue, success, failure, Perseverance etc. were pointed out.

On the second day, in the first session, the preacher narrated two incidents in connection with the power of prayer. Both the incidents were healing from cancer. He explained how beautifully God intervened in the lives of these people by the power of prayer. Jesus can raise those who lost hope. The prayer of a priest is very powerful. But today many priests are ashamed to pray. He also showed examples of prayer from the life of Jesus. Jesus was praying from his childhood. His parents were his models for prayer life.

He began the second session with the story of a bird that was wounded. He further pointed out that we all are wounded birds and the world has wounded us in different ways. Life is a mystery. We do not know what will happen next in our life. He further narrated the story of a young girl who won the game with rigorous practice for a day. He concluded the session with a game. The third session in the afternoon was of prayer and healing service.







Social Apostolate through Pastoral Apostolate

Ananthapalli parish has 6 substations such as Thelikicharla, Chodavaram, Pothavaram, Pothineedupalem, Subadrapalem, and Cheepurugudem. They are entrusted to our pastoral as well as spiritual care. Besides the spiritual nourishment of the faithful with the administration of the Sacraments and the breaking of the Word of God, we have undertaken following Social projects:

- ✓ With the help of Mother Vannini hospital which is run by Camillian sisters we have conducted medical camps in all our substations which helped a lot to our people in their medical needs.
- ✓ With the help of Jagruthi Hospital from Tadepalligudem, we have conducted the free eye medical camps as well as free eye operations in all the substations.
- ✓ We are conducting free dental camps with the help of Smile Dental Hospital from Nallajerla in all the substations.
- ✓ We have started the education of the students by conducting tuitions in our Churches and Catechism to the youth and children.
- ✓ We have started to construct four grottos in our substations namely Chodavaram, Cheepurugudem, and Subadrapalem.
- ✓ With the local contribution and our community, we are painting 2 big Churches namely Thelikicharla and Subadrapalem which have not been painted for a long time.
